





1ST POEM


All that is gold does not glitter,


- ▶ Do you like to travel?

FRODO AND SAM


- ▶ Captured by orcs

- ▶ Travel to meet many people, visit many places


- ▶ We begin to see the transformation of Strider the Ranger into Aragorn the King!

NEW CHARACTERS


- ▶ Faramir vs. Boromir




